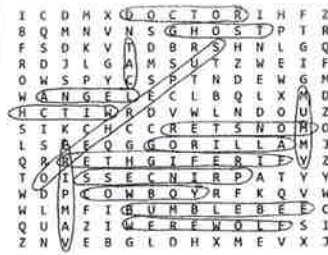
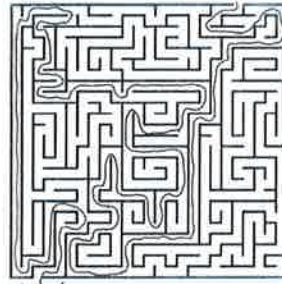

## **GHOUL-OSH**

(GOULASH)

### INGREDIENTS:

1lb lean ground beef  
1 1/2 cups macaroni  
1 quart stewed tomatoes  
2 teaspoons paprika  
1 tablespoon chili powder  
1/2 cup chopped onion  
1 clove garlic, minced  
6 ounces tomato paste  
1 green bell pepper, diced  
1 cup sliced mushrooms  
Parmesan  
Salt & pepper

### DIRECTIONS:

1. In a large saucepan brown ground beef and drain.
2. Add tomatoes, onions, garlic, bell pepper, mushrooms, paprika, chili powder and tomato paste. Add water a tablespoon at a time, if mixture seems too dry. Simmer on low.
3. Bring a large pot of lightly salted water to a boil. Add macaroni and cook about 8 minutes or until al dente: drain.
4. Add cooked macaroni to beef mixture. Sprinkle with parmesan and salt and pepper to taste.





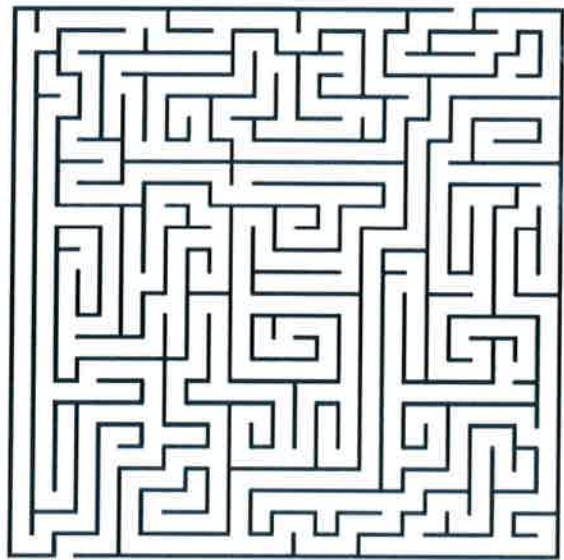

**REFLECTIONS OF U.S.:**  
**LUCIFER UNLEASHED: THE SALEM WITCH TRIALS**

It had been over seventy years since the Pilgrim landing at Plymouth Rock (Plymouth Bay), Massachusetts. They shook the salt waters of the Atlantic out of their hair; those that settled in New England were at their last good nerve, cross, jittery and twitchy with hardships, vicious wolves, fierce winters, smallpox fears and fear of attacks by wild Indians. The biggest fear that would befall the Puritans happened in Salem, Massachusetts, not far from Boston, in February, 1692. At the Parsonage of Rev. Samuel Parris, there was a commotion when his 11 year old daughter, Betty, was having screaming fits; she and Abigail, the Reverend's niece, was soon examined by the town doctor, who came to a startling conclusion that the little girls, along with eight more girls from the village..... all were cursed. Thus, Lucifer and witches are at evil work, and the Witch Madness at Salem village began. From the spring through the autumn, tall tales of magic from a Caribbean slave named Tituba began the hysteria, after she told these wild stories to the girls of the village. In March, Tituba and two more women, Sarah Good and Sarah Osborne, were brought before the Court presided by Judge Samuel Sewall (1652 - 1730), in which Cotton Mather (1663 - 1728) concurred with the evidence. Before September came, the trial with accusations and finger-pointing continued; before autumn, nineteen innocent Puritans, including that of Rebecca Nurse, Giles Corwin and Bridget Bishop, would face the hangman's rope at Gallows Hill. It soon became so bad in Massachusetts that while the Witch Trial were being held at Salem, two dogs in the nearby town of Andover were shot dead, accused of being witches. By May, 1693, the Royal Governor of Massachusetts pardoned anyone accused of Witchcraft and the Legislature of the Colony voted to pay the families of those who lost their lives during the Trials. Also, interestingly enough, John Hawthorne, who great-great-grand-son, Nathaniel Hawthorne (author of "The Scarlet Letter") was one of the Judges during the Witch Trials. As we prepare ourselves for the scariest, yet fun night of the year, Hallowe'en, with witches, monsters and ghosts, let us look upon Salem village, for it played a mean chapter in our Nation's History, as the Minions of Lucifer went unleashed in a small New England village, at a time when fear and hate ruled over both innocence and common sense.

Nineteen innocent Puritans at Salem village, including Bridget Bishop, faced death by hanging, accused of witchcraft during the Witchcraft Trials of 1692.
